

Funza Lushaka Bursary

The Funza Lushaka Bursary Programme is a multi-year programme to promote teaching as a profession. Bursaries are available to enable eligible students to complete a teaching qualification in an area of national priority. Recipients of these bursaries will be required to teach at a public school for the same number of years that they received the bursary. The bursary is awarded for one academic year at a time, and upon proof of academic success the bursary may be renewed each year until the recipient of the bursary has qualified as a teacher. The recipient is required to apply online for the renewal of the bursary every year.

Please note the following:

- All first-time applicants must be 30 years or younger to apply for Funza Lushaka Bursary.
- Having applied for the bursary is not a guarantee that you will receive it.
- It is important for all new applicants to also apply for alternate forms of funding, e.g., NSFAS, financing at a financial institution (bank, etc.).
- Bursaries are awarded on grounds of academic merit as well as specialisation in specific priority areas (subjects) identified by the Department of Basic Education (DBE).
- Only registered students will be considered for selection.
- All applications must be completed online at: www.funzalushaka.doe.gov.za
- No late applications will be considered.
- After your application has been completed online, you will be prompted to make a printout of your proof of application.
- You will be required to submit the following documents to the Faculty Bursary Coordinator:
 - Proof of application. This will serve as proof of your application. Keep a copy for yourself.
 - Certified copy of your FINAL grade 12 results (certification date not older than three months).

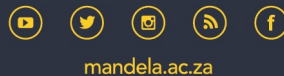

UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMMES OFFERED IN THE FACULTY OF EDUCATION:

B.Ed Foundation Phase

The Foundation Phase (FP) is a critical phase in the education of children. It lays the foundation and building blocks upon which learning can take place. Foundation Phase teachers are responsible for the educational foundation of children between the ages of five and nine (Grade R to Grade 3). How and what they teach profoundly influences the rest of these children's lives.

Post graduate Certificate in Education (PGCE) FET

Post graduate Certificate in Education (PGCE) SP-FET

The PGCE is a professional teaching qualification. It is offered both full-time (over one year) and part-time (over two years) at the Nelson Mandela University's South Campus in Gqeberha (Port Elizabeth). PGCE (FET) graduates will be equipped to teach two subjects at FET level (grade 10 to 12) and PGCE (SP-FET) graduates will be equipped to teach one subject at FET level (grade 10 to 12) and one subject at Senior Phase level (grade 7 to 9).
