

Application for admission for a teaching qualification (B.Ed. or PGCE) is required before you apply for the Funza Lushaka Bursary. You will need a valid student number in order to complete the online application for the Funza Lushaka Bursary.



- The Funza Lushaka Bursary Programme is a multi-year programme to promote teaching as a profession. It is funded by National Treasury and executed by the Department of Basic Education (DBE).
- The bursary is <u>awarded on merit and exceptional performance</u>. An exemption, an endorsement or an "admission to Bachelor's degree studies" pass at matric/grade 12 level is required.
- Bursaries are available to enable selected students to complete a teaching qualification in <u>identified areas of priority</u>.
- The applicant must meet both the requirement for admission at university and the Funza Lushaka Bursary requirement.
- Recipients of this bursary will be required to teach at a <u>public school</u> for the same number of years that they receive the bursary.



- Online applications are open from 01 OCTOBER 2020 to the first week of January 2021.

- Adhere to all the instructions as you complete the online application <a href="https://www.eservices.gov.za/">https://www.eservices.gov.za/</a>
- After your application has been <u>submitted</u> online, you will be prompted to make a printout. This will serve as proof of your application. Keep a copy for yourself, and submit a copy to the Faculty Bursary Coordinator.



- The University Bursary Selection Committee meets and processes all bursary applications during February and March 2021.
- The Funza Lushaka Bursary Coordinator at the University will notify you, not later than 30 April 2021, as to whether you have been awarded the bursary or not.
- Having applied for the bursary is not a guarantee that you will get it.
- Due to the high demand for bursary funding and enrolments in teacher education, all applicants are advised to apply for other funding as well, e.g. NSFAS.

# National Student Financial Aid Scheme (NSFAS)

#### Who qualifies for NSFAS funding?



- All South African citizens.
- All SASSA grant recipients qualifies for funding.
- Applicants whose combined household income is not more than R350 000 per annum (first-time applicant for NSFAS and first-time admission to an Higher Education Institution).
- Person with disability: Combined household income must not be more than R600 000 per annum
- Students who started studying before 2018 whose household income is not more than R122 000 per annum.
